Principal's Message

The return to school after half term has gone extremely smoothly. Lessons have been calm, focused, and hard working. It has been great to see so many students getting involved in extra-curricular activities which really develops their passions and understanding of subjects or areas of interest.

A reminder that it is not long until the start of Year 11 mock exams - I have been impressed with the way they are really committing to all of the revision opportunities that are available to them in the school.

My assemblies this week have been called "Everyone needs a friend like Kevin" and explored the relationship between Kevin Sinfield and Rob Burrows, both of whom played rugby at club and international level together. Since retiring Rob Burrows has developed Motor Neurone Disease and Kevin has worked tirelessly to raise awareness, fundraise, and support the MND community. I closed the assembly with some key messages:

- In a world where you can choose to be anything, be kind.
- Kevin's resilience, work ethic and determination are all things that students can take into the classroom.
- Finally, we are a no-banter school as this often leads to misunderstandings and upset. Students can report anything that is upsetting them or another student to any adult in the school and we will do our best resolve the situation.
