### Principal's Message

Our attendance across the school continues to show improvements in comparison to last year — as always a massive well done and thank you to students and parents for this. We have launched our 100% Last Week awards which recognises all students who had excellent attendance in the previous week. My congratulations to all students who received one of these awards.

Last night I had the pleasure of meeting Year 10 parents at the Consultation Evening, and it was great to hear so many positives about students' learning, staff feedback and just how well their children were doing at Coleridge.

As a school, today we took part in our own act of remembrance by holding our own two minutes silence. Students were exceptional as they paused their lessons to show their respect and honoured everyone who has been and continues to be affected by conflict across the world.

Next week marks the beginning of the first set of mocks for Year 11. Students have been working hard in their lessons, collecting more revision materials from their teachers, and attending our Revision Club that runs every day during lunchtime. We have also spoken to all our Year 11s about the importance of eating properly, sleeping and taking care of themselves during exam season. This includes managing their revision while still taking the time to take part in activities that they enjoy outside of school. Staff have all been impressed with the focus they have been showing to their studies and are hopeful that they start to see the benefits of this hard work as they enter this exam period feeling confident and prepared for their assessments.

As a reminder, Year 11 students will be able to enter the school site at 8.00 am and breakfast will be provided in the canteen for all Year 11 students every morning during the mock period. Staff will be there to support and ensure they are answering any last-minute questions or concerns that students may have. Year 11 will also leave Period 4 ten minutes early during the mocks to ensure they have time to eat their lunch and have a chance to relax before sitting their



afternoon exams.

#### Year 7 & Year 8 Autumn Fest – 2023

On Tuesday evening this week we held our annual Y7 & Y8 Autumn Showcase in the Radegund Hall. The Autumn Showcase is an event (concert) led (in its entirety) by student Music Ambassadors and exists to showcase the wonderful performance work of our Y7 and Y8 students.

Over the last 2 months, the Music Ambassadors have been working hard to promote, audition and rehearse acts for the event which culminated **in over 80 students** performing. The acts on display ranged from auditioned pieces (musical solos, dances and drama) to club work (Carnival Crew 2, PFO3 (beginner orchestra)) and even included some class work – Y7 African Drumming. We were pleased to be able to celebrate and showcase our wonderful students with a packed audience of approximately 150 of the students' families and friends. It was a fantastic night of entertainment with lots of talent on display – especially considering that our Y7s have only been with us for one half term – the future of Create is looking very, very bright! 
