Black Friday

We are sharing this advice as on online shopping at this festive time and hope it will be useful both for yourselves and for you to discuss at home with your children. Navigating through the influx of bargain deals inundating your inbox and social media feeds can be challenging, especially when distinguishing between legitimate offers and potential scams. Exercise extra caution when it comes to Black Friday deal emails that land in your inbox. Take the time to thoroughly verify the sender's details and inspect all links before clicking on them.

Instead of just following the link provided in the email, it is advisable to visit the retailer's website directly. This precautionary measure can help you steer clear of any potentially malicious links, ensuring a safer online shopping experience.

Classic signs that a Black Friday deal may be a scam:

- Unrealistically low prices, so always check that the price of the item is consistent with other websites.
- Being promoted on a recently created website without a privacy policy, postal address or an 'about us' page. Use a domain checker like who.is to check when the website was created, a newly created website should ring alarm bells.
- Being posted from a newly created social media account.
- Only allowing you to pay via bank transfer which offers very limited protection in the event of a scam, so opt for credit or debit card or PayPal instead.
- Bad reviews can be a giveaway, but make sure you know the signs of a fake review.
- An impersonated URL check that the website URL is that of the official brand as it will only have one official website.
