#### **Careers**

Costello Medical hosted Year 8 students on 28 November for some experience of a career in medical communication. Coleridge students delivered an excellent pitch, presenting the Pharmacodynamics, unmet needs, clinical and economic value for the psoriasis drug Certolizumab pegol and winning the award for best pitch from the Costello Medical Staff.





#### **Year 10 Science**

Year 10 have been investigating the structure of the leaf. Whilst doing this experiment students prepared slides of the top and bottom of a leaf, with the aim of comparing the difference in its structure.

In this image, we can see two large Stomata or 'pores' on the bottom of their leaf. These Stomata allow carbon dioxide into the leaf and oxygen to leave the leaf in the process of Photosynthesis.

## PE 'Dragons' Den' Project: Year 7

On Tuesday 28 November, 16 year 7 students completed a 'Dragons' Den' project.

Students attended a workshop delivered by Living Sport. In the workshop, they looked at the importance of inclusivity, diversity, project planning (including budgeting, contingency plans, marketing strategies, promotion ideas etc), what it involves running an extra-curricular club as well as learning skills on how to present/pitch and looking at how to create a persuasive presentation/pitch.

The Living Sport programme centres around youth voice and provides a platform for students to create and implement their own extracurricular club within Coleridge.

At the end of the workshop, students presented their ideas and the panel discussed and decided that the team that presented a 'Glow' in the dark fitness session was the winner! Watch this space, the group of students will have a £1,000 funding to spend on their new extra-curricular club. Exciting!
