Principal's Message

Dear Families,

I do hope that you have had a great week. I spoke in assemblies this week about 'culture', I asked students what they thought the word meant and I'm pleased to say that the responses were absolutely first rate. Students spoke of beliefs and shared values and my response was that for me in the school setting, culture is 'what we do around here and the way that we do it', certainly it is about the way the school feels. Culture is about what we do every day. I'm extremely proud of how respectful students are of one another and as mentioned in previous weeks, it is lovely to see how they interact with the staff at the school so positively. Coleridge is a special place and I do believe the students and staff reflect that day in day out.

I would like to apologise for the previous lack of communication about the Year 11 examinations and hope that I can address some of those concerns here. I have been asked by a few people about whether the school is considering exam leave for the Year 11 students and I think that it is worth addressing that here. The last 2 years have been very disruptive in educational terms, and students have been affected considerably. To provide as much support as we can at this time therefore, students will continue to follow their normal timetable with their classroom teachers. Lessons will be focused on revision to ensure students enter their exams with the knowledge and confidence necessary to succeed.

We have put on breakfast each morning for students who have an exam and we have extended lunchtime for Year 11 students to allow them to get their lunch earlier so that they have more time to participate in revision sessions, do private study or use the extra time to relax with their friends. The morning exams start at 9am and the afternoon sessions begin at 1.30pm.

I will ensure that each week, the exam timetable is sent to you for you to know what is taking place. Next week we have the following exams:





PE 'Dragons Den' Project; Year 8

20 year 8 students have started a Pe 'Dragons' Den project on Thursday 5 May. This programme centres around youth voice and provides a platform for your students to create and implement their own extra-curricular club within Coleridge.

Students attended a workshop delivered by Living Sport. In the workshop, they looked at the importance of inclusivity, diversity, project planning (including budgeting, contingency plans, marketing strategies, promotion ideas etc), what it involves in running an extra-curricular club as well as learning skills on how to present/pitch and looking at how to create a persuasive presentation/pitch.

After this initial workshop, Living Sport will arrange a pitch date 4-6 weeks later. Here the students will present their ideas for their extra-curricular clubs to a panel.

This is the 'Dragon's Den' part of the programme. The panel would then discuss which extra-curricular club to choose, and then these students would get the opportunity to create this club within the school settings for their fellow students.

Living Sport will fund these students £1000 for their extracurricular club which can be spent on equipment, coaches/ instructors, promotional tools etc.

If you apply and qualify for Free School Meals, your child's school will receive additional funding called Pupil Premium, up to £1,320 a year.

Even though all children in Key Stage 1 receive Universal Infant Free School Meals, your child's school can only benefit from Pupil Premium funding if you apply, and are eligible, for Free School Meals. Don't delay the funding ... apply today!

Schools spend the pupil premium money on anything that can help your children do well at school, including trips, activities and extra support.

Applying online only takes a few minutes and, if eligible, your child will continue to receive Free School Meals until:

The end of Year 6 (if they are in primary school on 31 August 2023

The end of Year II (if they are in secondary school on 31 August 2023

This is even if your income rises above the threshold at any point during that time.

To get free school meals you need to be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop working altogether or start to work less than 16 hours per week)
- . Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190




