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Principal's Message

Good afternoon everyone, I hope you are well. This has been another busy and eventful week at Coleridge. On Monday we were fortunate enough to welcome the former Children's Poet Laureate Michael Rosen and composer Andrea Cockerton to our school along with historian Helen Weinstein from Historyworks. A big thank you to Mr Burgess for organising the event which took place in the Radegund Hall in front of the Year 7 and Year 8 students. Please do see the write-up in the newsletter from Mr Burgess for all the details but needless to say the students absolutely loved the active role they played in creating some unique poetry. The event continues on Sunday at 4pm when a number of our Drama students and the Coleridge Choir will be performing at the Refugee Fundraiser Event at the Cambridge Corn Exchange. I would like to say a huge thanks to all concerned for getting involved to raise money and awareness for this worthwhile cause.

The EcoClub led by Mr Pearce and Mrs Bright have been awarded an 'Eco-Schools Green Flag'. This is a fantastic achievement which recognises the great work the students and staff have been doing to raise environmental awareness across the school. Students demonstrate continue to plan and work on the Eco-Nature Garden, recycling schemes and waste reduction. It also highlighted the planning work that is in place to ensure that Coleridge continues to focus on the environment with significant projects in the pipeline for the new academic year. There was also special mention of how this planning linked across a variety of curriculum areas and that the organisation were impressed with the group's sustainable approach which will mean environmental matters will continue to be a priority for years to come.

I was delighted to be asked to be a panel judge for the Living Sport Dragon's Den Project. Year 8 students were tasked with planning a sport to be introduced at Coleridge that would perhaps sit outside 'traditional' sports whilst ensuring inclusivity and accessibility by all. The winning team stood to receive a cheque for £1000 towards the set-up costs. In order to win this funding, students had to demonstrate why they thought their respective sports were likely to be received positively by other students and had to think carefully about budgeting and marketing. The students were incredible and the presentations about Boxercise, Dodgeball, Tchoukball and Kinball were equally engaging. I think most impressive was the students' ability to think on their feet when they came 'under pressure' in the question-and-answer session. Kinball was the winner so I will let Mr Dixon give further details in due course about how your son or daughter can get involved in this exciting new sport. Well done to all the students involved in this event.

Tonight the Coleridge Carnival Crew will be performing in front of representatives and award winners from the many United Learning schools from around the country at the BiE Awards Evening in Leeds. I am delighted that our Coleridge Music Ambassadors will be accepting the *Team of the Year* Award. On both counts, we are extremely proud. To be able to both showcase and celebrate the talented youngsters from the school at such a high-profile event is a real honour they will do us proud tonight, just as they do when they are at school.

The Year 11 students have almost finished their exams, with only a couple of exams left on Monday for a small group of students. I know this is something I have said previously on numerous occasions, but I am so proud of how they have coped over the last few weeks. They have shown real dedication, focus and stamina and I am really looking forward to seeing them on Tuesday at 11am for the Leaver's Assembly where we will celebrate their efforts. It isn't goodbye of course as we will see them at the Prom and on the results day, but it will be an emotional event nevertheless.

As we look towards the end of term, I would like to inform you of a change of date. In the summer holidays, the school is going to be refurbished in a number of areas and this time will give the staff the opportunity to ready the school. Students will now be finishing Term 6 on **Wednesday 20th July**

at 12.30pm. I intend to send round further details in a separate letter. Many thanks for your support as always and I will be in touch again early next week.


